How to shoot lighting bugs

DIGITAL CORNER

Q: When I try to take pictures of lightning bugs all I get are black photos. Has anyone tried or been successful with taking them? I live in a wooded area, and they look so beautiful!

A: Try setting your ISO to the highest possible setting. This will make your camera more sensitive to light. A high ISO setting will also give a grainier look. Or try placing the camera on BULB mode, holding the shutter open for a few seconds then allowing it to close. Experiment. This is how you can do fireworks pictures, and lightning bugs are a little bit like that (on & off)... it may be worth a try. Use a tripod & cable release. www.betterphoto.com

Message from Dan Scenna

Greetings All:

I have good news to share with all of you. Before I go further, I want to thank everyone for your prayers, good wishes and positive thoughts. If you aren't sure they work, let me assure you they do.

In case you missed the beginning of this situation, the need for my heart surgery was discovered, while preparing me for possible lung surgery for cancer. That diagnosis came from a foggy spot on an x-ray and a hot spot on a PET Scan. Those are normally very bad things to have. The heart surgery came about when they tested me to see if I'd survive the lung operation. Looking back, the odds on that were not at all good.

Once it was determined how badly I needed the triple by-pass, I was lucky enough to be at one of the top hospitals in the country for that operation and one of the top heart surgeons in the world happened to have a free morning the next day.... I know it sounds like one of my stories, but this is all true. So he took care of me. Importantly, while I was there and under anesthesia, a lung surgeon also did a thorough biopsy of the hotspot in my lung.

I just received the results of the biopsy and a follow up CT Scan. Everything came back negative. I have inflamed lymph glands. Evidently 15% of all Americans do. The inflammation has receded dramatically. My lung surgeon has officially thrown me out as "you're too healthy, I can't do anything with you unless you have cancer".... As nice as he is, I've decided to go ahead and not see him anymore, if those are his conditions.

So, there you have it. My heart surgery saved me from having a heart attack, possibly a fatal one, & certainly a crippling one in the recovery process. And it was all made possible by a small false positive on an x-ray. It's a strange way to be lucky, but I'll take it. As it stands now, I'll be able to dance at my grandson Jessie's wedding... in case you don't know he just turned 4 weeks old today.

I still have a ways to go in the recovery process. There is a bit of a worry that I have a small infection that needs to be followed up on. And, a piece of advice from me; if you ever have surgery, never, ever sneeze afterwards.

I am doing well otherwise. I am open for visitors. I am feeling on top of the world!
Just thought you should all know the good news.

Stolen Nikon D70 kits

Nikon Europe has today informed us that 18 cartons with 108 D70s (including 18-70 DX lenses) were stolen at Schiphol Airport in The Netherlands. Nikon is asking for your help in tracing these stolen cameras and has provided a list of serial numbers as well as important information relating to the packaging of these particular digital SLR kits.

Press Release: Nikon Europe Warns Customers of Stolen D70 digital SLR Kits. A number of Nikon D70 digital SLR camera kits destined for Spain have been stolen from Schiphol Airport, Amsterdam, The Netherlands, on July 17, 2004. The kits comprised of a D70 body with AF-S DX Nikkor 18-70G lens, battery, charger and English and Spanish language User manuals. Importantly they also carry a Warranty Card carrying the following address of Nikon's Spanish distributor Finicon S.A.

A spokesman said: "Nikon would like to take the opportunity to warn the trade and customers to be wary about unrealistically low prices being offered for D70 bodies, 18-70mm lenses, batteries or chargers without retail packaging or valid warranty cards or manuals.
