Freelance News Photographer Leslie E. Kossoff has freelanced for various publications and companies in the Washington, DC area since 1992. Kossoff was working as a staff photographer for a daily newspaper in Manassas, VA when she ventured out to pursue a full-time freelance career. She has since worked for the mainstream media and various public, private and non-profit organizations. Her work has been seen in various publications, large and small, worldwide. Kossoff's style is heavily influenced by her work as a Photojournalist and is reflective and documentary in nature.

Kossoff received a BS degree in Photojournalism from Boston University in 1992. She is a member of the Senate Press Photographers Gallery, with credentials on Capitol Hill and The White House. Kossoff is a member of the National Press Photographers Association (NPPA), Greater Washington Board of Trade, and Women Business Owners of Montgomery County. Creature Feature – Kevin Logghe Kevin Logghe has been compiling a photographic record of the world around us for over 25 years. Born in Worthington, Minnesota in 1959, he studied Art History at the University of Minnesota and Philosophy at Christ Church College, Oxford.



Asked to characterize his art, Kevin is quick to tell you: "I continue to respond to the world as the small town boy I was. I am haunted and captivated by scenes of a way of life that has ceased to be, as seen in my "whispers" series. At the same time I am almost overwhelmed by the collisions of color and images in the urban areas of America as seen in "Traces of Red". Artistically I draw on painters and their use of light and shadow, in particular Rembrandt and Whistler."

His ongoing studies of photography have included the Maine Photographic Workshops, the Cape Cod Photo

well as independent study across the US, Great Britain and Ireland. Logghe's work can be found in numerous private and corporate collections. He has been featured on "Fox Morning News" and in numerous print publications.

Kevin was recently recognized in the Annual National Juried Photo Competition sponsored by the Washington Gallery of Photography. His pieces, "Final Lesson" and "Cumulus Rising" were awarded Third Place and Honorable Mention, respectively. The competition winners will be on display at the gallery at 4850 Rugby Avenue, Bethesda, MD Oct 8 - Nov 8. He was also awarded 1st Place in the National Juried Competition "Looking for America" at The Washington Gallery of Photography on September 10. The photo was displayed at the gallery thru Oct 6.

Richard Avedon passes away at 81 yrs. Oct 1, 2004 - Considered as one of the masters of 20th century fashion photography, Richard Avedon photographed for HARPER'S BAZAAR, VOGUE, LOOK, and a number of other magazines. During the early years, Avedon made his living primarily through work in advertising. His real passion, however, was the portrait and its ability to express the essence of its subject.

DIGITAL CORNER

Q: I have seen many recommendations for acquiring a 50mm lens. Why?

A: The magnification and visual perspective - from foreground to background - is closest with a 50mm to how our eyes and brain perceive the world allowing us to accurately record what we saw. 50mm's are also faster, and can be used in lower light. It's a good way of learning and improving. Too many people think they have to have a certain lens. They don't involve themselves enough - by depending on Program mode and depending on a zoom instead of moving. I've seen it described as a perfect balance between expanse and intimacy, and to me that's on point. I think it's the most under-rated lens, as far as focal lengths. Especially for portraits.
